

#### **STEM Careers**

- 72% of all UK businesses rely on people with STEM skills – [Qualifications in Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics]
- 58% of all new jobs will be STEM related.
- The number of those studying for degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics must increase by over 40% on current levels if demand is to be met.
- Most science and engineering companies provide training opportunities and map out long term career paths.
- There is a demand for people with STEM skills globally; careers can often include the opportunity for international travel.

CONFIDENCE	Presents a strong, professional, positive image to others which inspires confidence & commands respect.
DRIVE	Determination to get things done. Make things happen & constantly looking for better ways of doing things.
FLEXIBILITY	Adapt successfully to changing situations & environments
ICT SKILLS	Word-processing, using databases, spreadsheets, the Internet & email, designing web pages etc.
INITIATIVE/SELF	Able to act on initiative, identify opportunities & proactive in putting forward ideas & solutions
MOTIVATION	
NUMERACY	Multiply & divide accurately, calculate percentages, use statistics & a calculator, interpret graphs &
	tables.
ORAL COMMUNICATION	Able to express your ideas clearly and confidently in speech
PLANNING & ORGANISING	Able to plan activities & carry them through effectively
PROBLEM SOLVING	Gather information systematically to establish facts & principles, then find solutions
SELF AWARENESS	Awareness of achievements, abilities, values & weaknesses & what you want out of life.
TEAMWORK	Work confidently within a group
TIME MANAGEMENT	Manage time effectively, prioritising tasks and able to work to deadlines.
WRITTEN COMMUNICATION	Able to express yourself clearly in writing
